Mr. Johnson recommended MSA award CAM Construction Inc. the construction contract in the amount of \$22,354,170 for the renovation of Highlandtown Elementary/Middle School. The GMP includes the trade packages necessary to complete the project. The overall MBE participation goal for the project has been set at 30%, and the MBE participation for the overall project meets the goal. MSA's Board and the Board of Public Works approved the preconstruction contract at the April 7, 2020 meeting.

<u>Coppin State Public Safety Building:</u> Kick off and stakeholder meetings are underway. <u>Historic St. Mary's:</u> Kick off scheduled for next week.
