This funding request is consistent with the 2017 Affiliated Foundation Bill that was passed into law to support Maryland Sports. The Bill allows the Maryland Stadium to allocate up to five hundred thousand dollars annually to support organizations MSA/Maryland Sports affiliates with or develops. The Sport and Entertainment Corporation of Maryland is the first affiliated foundation developed under this legislation.
